Notice of Primary for Partisan Office and Referendums

Notice is hereby given that the Fall Primary Election for Partisan Office will be held at the Town Hall, E6591 627th Ave., Menomonie, on Tuesday, August 13, 2024. Electors may vote for candidates in only one political party (Democratic, Republican, Constitution, Libertarian, or Wisconsin Green). Congressional, Legislative and State, and Dunn County offices are on the ballot (all vote for one). Democratic Party Primary: U.S. Senator (Tammy Baldwin); U.S. Dist. 3 Rep. in Congress (Rebecca Cooke, Katrina Shankland, or Eric Wilson); Dist. 92 State Assembly Rep. (Joe Plouff or Caden G. Berg); Dist. Attorney (none); Co. Clerk (Andrew Mercil or James Erickson); Co. Treasurer (none); Co. Register of Deeds (Heather M. Kuhn). Republican Party Primary: U.S. Senator (Eric Hovde, Charles E. Barman, or Rejani Raveendran); U.S. Dist. 3 Rep. in Congress (Derrick Van Orden); Dist. 92 State Assembly Rep. (Clint Moses); Dist. Attorney (Andrea Nodolf); Co. Clerk (none); Co. Treasurer (Lynn Niggemann); Co. Register of Deeds (none). Constitution Party Primary: No candidates listed. Libertarian Party Primary: No candidates listed. Wisconsin Green Party Primary: No candidates listed. State Referendum Question 1: “*Delegation of appropriation power*. Shall section 35(1) of article IV of the constitution be created to provide that the legislature may not delegate its sole power to determine how moneys shall be appropriated?”. State Referendum Question 2: *Allocation of federal moneys*. Shall 35(2) of article IV of the constitution be created to prohibit the governor from allocating any federal moneys the governor accepts on behalf of the state without the approval of the legislature by joint resolution or as provided by legislative rule?”. The polls open at 7:00 a.m. and close at 8:00 p.m. The number of provisional ballots will be posted at the town hall and town website on election night, as will the date, time, and location of the MBOC, if required. *An acceptable PHOTO ID is required to receive a ballot. An acceptable PROOF OF RESIDENCY document is required to register to vote.
